ABOUT US



Rodeo is one of the oldest and most exciting sports in America. The Colorado State High School Rodeo Association and Colorado Junior High Rodeo Association (CSHSRA and CJHRA) represent Colorado as one of 41 states, 5 Canadian provinces, Mexico and Australia; together comprising the National High School Rodeo Association (NHSRA.)



Founded in 1947, NHSRA membership includes 12,500 students competing in over 1,100 sanctioned rodeos every year. CSHSRA and CJHRA members must be enrolled in school and meet scholastic eligibility requirements to compete at the state level. The top four state level contestants in each event qualify to compete in the National Junior High School Finals Rodeo held in June or the National High School Finals Rodeo held in July. These rodeos boast over 2,500 contestants competing for national titles, awards, and scholarships. By being a student member of the CSHSRA, contestants also have an opportunity to be awarded college scholarships and scholarship assistance for continuing their educational careers.
